She immigrated to this country and immediately began working tirelessly to bring us to join her. I can't imagine how daunting that must have felt - building a new life in an unfamiliar place, all for the sake of her children's future.

Once we were all reunited in the United States, Mom continued to be the anchor that held our family together through her unconditional love and wisdom. She had a way of setting us straight with just one look - that stern gaze that let you know you had crossed a line. But it came from a place of deep care and an unwavering will to protect her loved ones.

My Mom was generally a calm and reserved woman, she was fiercely protective of her family. If she ever sensed someone was trying to take advantage of us, she roared like a lioness shielding her cubs. She simply would not be pushed around or allow harm to come to those she loved. That fighting spirit was something she imbued in us from a young age - a testament to her own fortitude and the high esteem in which she held self-advocacy.

Amid the sacrifices and struggles, Mom always maintained a generosity of spirit and found immense joy in simple pleasures. She loved soaking in the beauty of nature, learning about wildlife, and contributing in her own small way to conservation. Watching those nature documentaries brought her such peace and wonder.

She took just as much delight in celebrating the milestones of her family and friends, always remembering birthdays and special occasions with her trademark thoughtfulness.

In so many ways, Mom's life was one of quiet strength and selfless service to others. For over 30 years, she worked tirelessly as a home health aide, caring for the elderly with the same compassion and dignity she embued in all her endeavors. The people she cared for in their homes became like a second family to her. And toward the end, when mom required care herself, she welcomed the aides who supported her with that same open heart. In her final years, as mom's health declined, that love for family manifested in the simplest yet most profound ways. Despite her struggles, her first priority was always checking in on how we were doing. In those tender moments, she would look each of us in the eye and say "I love you" with a warmth and sincerity that still envelops my heart. Those words, and her entire life, were a masterclass in unconditional love.

So today, we don't mourn the loss of Lystra Morgan. Instead, we celebrate the extraordinary human being she was and the countless lives she impacted through her generosity, resilience, and unwavering care for her loved ones. Though she may have lacked formal education herself, her life's greatest lessons were imparted through her actions:

The importance of family. The dignity of honest work. The power of love, freely given. The courage to overcome adversity. The grace of a compassionate spirit.

These are the enduring teachings that will forever guide us and keep Mom's beautiful spirit alive in our hearts.

For me, and I know for all of you, she will always be that shining example of how to lead a life of purpose, decency, and boundless love for those around you.

In the days and years ahead, when we find ourselves faced with a challenging moment or decision, I hope we can call upon the strength and wisdom Mom embodied so fully. I hope we can hear her voice gently encouraging us to keep going, to stand up for what's right, and to approach the world with open arms and open hearts - just as she did.

May we all strive to walk through this world as she did - with an undying love for our families, a generous spirit, and a human decency that made an indelible impact on all who knew her.
